Solid Waste Fund (SWF) Overview

- Solid Waste Fund is an Enterprise Fund
- User fees set for full cost recovery
- Prior to 2010 the General Fund provided a subsidy to the SWF
- Township financial policy calls for Township to strive to maintain 10% fund balance level for emergencies and contingencies
 - This level while sufficient, is less than recommended levels by GFOA for enterprise funds
- Refuse Division provides trash and recycling collection services for almost 16,800 residential customers and collects annually
 - o 17,700 tons of trash
 - o 3,500 tons of recycled paper
 - o 2,400 tons of commingled products







Solid Waste Fund Fee History

- 2013 SWF fees increased 9% except for Rear Yard Collection Fee
- 2014 SWF fees increased 5.4%
- 2017 SWF fees increased 5% except for Rear Yard Collection Fee
- 2.4% compounded annual growth rate in SWF fees since 2010

Solid Waste Fund Subscriptions

- Over 16,800 subscriptions (at over 16,250 individual locations)
 - Nearly 85% of subscriptions are at the mini-can, one can or two can level

Solid Waste Fund Subscriptions

- Since 2011 residents have increasingly moved to lower can levels and rear yard subscriptions have fallen which constrains revenue
 - Mini-can up 39.9%; One can up 12.4%; Two cans up 3.4%
 - Three cans down 36.6%; Four or more cans down 27.6%
 - o Rear Yard down 11.4%

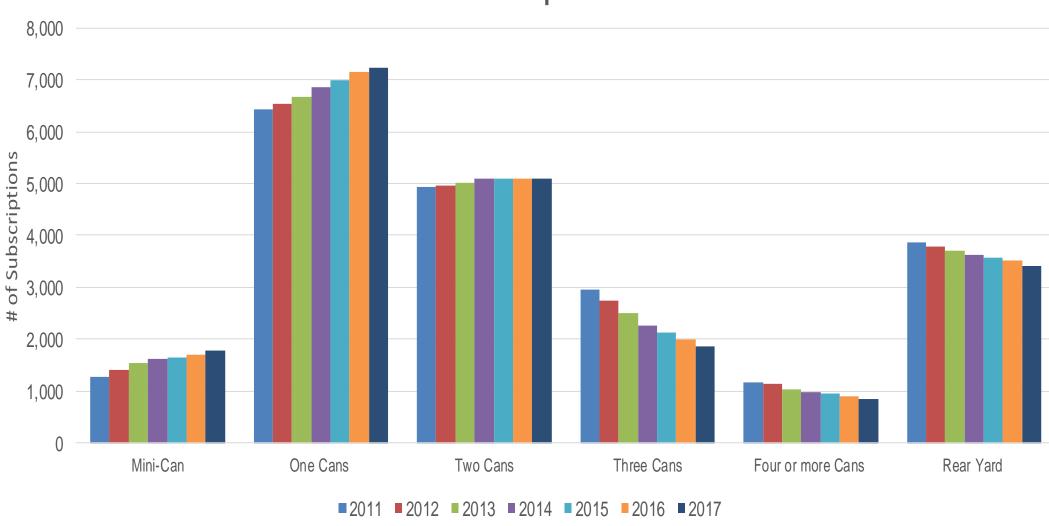

- Projected 2018 fund balance below 10% policy level; in line with previous staff estimates
- Assumptions
 - No increase in fee levels and no changes to operations/service
 - Trash disposal costs per existing contract



Solid Waste Fund Revenues

- SWF fee revenue growth is minimal absent fee increases
- Refuse collection compliance audit routes to ensure compliance
- Recycled paper market prices have been relatively stable with some recent growth
 - Avg. 2017 = \$94/Ton (current is only \$75/Ton)
 - o Dec 2016 = \$90/Ton
 - o Dec 2015 = \$75/Ton
 - o Dec 2014 = \$75/Ton
 - o Dec 2013 = \$65/Ton
 - o Dec 2012 = \$60/Ton
 - o Dec 2011 = \$75/Ton



Solid Waste Fund Expenditures

- Tipping fee set by contract with Covanta (2% annual increases)
 - o \$66.33/ton in 2017; \$1.175 million total
 - o \$67.65/ton in 2018; \$1.20 million total
 - o \$69.01/ton in 2019; \$1.25 million total
- Commingled disposal costs have declined from over \$90/ton earlier this year to \$54/ton currently. This line item is still a \$110,000 annual increase from 2014 to 2017 (estimated actual)
- Labor costs (wages and employee benefits) = \$4.1 million (2018)
- Vehicle rental rates for Equipment Fund = \$876,000 (2018)
- Transfer to General Fund for indirect costs = \$989,900 (2018)
- These costs represent 97% of 2018 projected SWF expenditures

Solid Waste Fund Fee Options for 2017

- While there are limited options outside of fee increases on the revenue side staff has developed some options for consideration
- These options would have an impact on "non-core" services funded through Solid Waste Fund
 - Eliminate one Clean-Up Weekend annually (\$25,500)
 - Defer street can re-painting in business districts (\$30,000)
 - o GF indirect cost level held flat at 2017 level (\$38,000)
 - Transition to Rear Yard Waiver exemption at 50% (\$40,000)
 - Eliminate one TV Collection Event annually (\$5,750)
 - Increase disposal fees paid at Transfer Station (\$50,000)
 - If all these options were approved by the Board the ending fund balance percentage would increase to 7.7% reducing the need for considering a fee adjustment

Solid Waste Fee Next Steps

- BOC decision on the appropriate SWF fee level for 2018
- If the BOC opts to increase SWF fees
 - BOC approves advertisement of Ordinance amending the Solid Waste Fee Schedule and Public Hearing
 - BOC holds Public Hearing and adopts Ordinance setting the 2018 Solid Waste Fee Schedule
- Solid Waste subscription change cards mailed to customers (tentatively scheduled for mid-to-late November)
- 2018 Solid Waste Bill is included with tax bill mailed Jan 31st
