AN ORDINANCE Of The Township Of Lower Merion, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania, Imposing A Levy For General Revenue Purposes On All Taxable Real Estate In The Township In The Amount Of 4.19 Mills (.00419) On Each One Dollar Of Assessed Valuation, Adopting An Annual Budget And Appropriating Specific Sums Estimated To Be Required For The Purposes Of The Municipal Government For The 2021 Fiscal Year, And Approving The 2021-2026 Capital Improvement Program (CIP).

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of Lower Merion does hereby enact and ordain as follows:

Section 1. <u>Tax Rate for General Purposes</u> That a tax be levied and the same is hereby levied on all real property within the Township of Lower Merion subject to taxation for the fiscal year 2021, as follows:

Tax rate for General Purposes: the sum of 4.19 mills on each one dollar of assessed valuation.

Section 2. <u>Budget and Appropriations.</u> The revenues estimated to be available to the Township of Lower Merion for fiscal year 2021 and the amounts appropriated there from for the specific purposes hereinafter set forth are as follows:

Section 3. <u>Approval of the 2021-2026 Capital Improvement Program.</u> The Board of Commissioners do hereby approve the 2021-2026 Capital improvement Program.

Section 4. An estimate of the specific items making up the amounts appropriated to the respective departments and a copy of the 2021-2026 Capital Improvement Program is on file in the Township Secretary's Office of the Township of Lower Merion, 75 E. Lancaster Avenue, Ardmore, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania.

Section 5. Nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed to affect any suit or process in any Court, any rights acquired or liability incurred, any permit issued, or any causes of action existing prior to the adoption of this Ordinance.

Section 6. The provision of this Ordinance are severable, and if any section, sentence, clause, part or provision thereof shall be held illegal, invalid, or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such decision of the Court shall not affect or impair the remaining sections, sentences, clauses parts or provisions of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared to be the intent of the Board that this Ordinance would have been adopted as if such illegal, invalid or unconstitutional section, sentence, clause, part or provision had not been included herein.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after January 1, 2021.
