Approval to add \$19,292 to the staff approved expense of \$75,000 for a total of \$94,292 including a contingency cost of \$10,000 to bring the property to minimum standards pursuant to CDBG regulations.

II. Why This Issue Requires Board Consideration:

The Lower Merion Township CDBG Residential Rehabilitation program requires staff to obtain approval from the Board of Commissioners when a Residential Rehabilitation project funded with CDBG funds exceeds \$75,000.

III. Current Policy or Practice (If Applicable):

Approval from the Board of Commissioners is required for Residential Rehabilitation projects exceeding the \$75,000 base threshold for expenditures.

IV. Other Relevant Background Information:

This Ardmore single family residence requires extensive lead removal, new electrical service, removal of all knob and tube wiring, complete re-wiring of the house, a new hot water heater, kitchen renovations, and relocation for the family of 6 people during lead remediation and re-wiring.

V. Impact on Township Finances:

There is no impact to the Township's finances. All funds are federal CDBG funds.

VI. Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the Board of Commissioners approve the additional funding request.

II. Why This Issue Requires Board Consideration:

The Lower Merion Township CDBG Residential Rehabilitation program requires staff to obtain approval from the Board of Commissioners when a Residential Rehabilitation project funded with CDBG funds exceeds \$75,000.

III. Current Policy or Practice (If Applicable):

Approval from the Board of Commissioners is required for Residential Rehabilitation projects exceeding the \$75,000 base threshold for expenditures.

IV. Other Relevant Background Information:

This Ardmore single family residence requires extensive lead removal, relocation of the family during lead work, a new roof, minor interior renovation, and a complete rebuild of the front porch including new foundations and careful tie in to the connected twin.

V. Impact on Township Finances:

There is no impact to the Township's finances. All funds are federal CDBG funds.

Staff recommends that the Board of Commissioners approve the additional funding request.

Approve adding \$41,598 to the previously approved expense of \$137,290 for a total of \$178,888 including a contingency cost of \$5,000 to bring this home in Ardmore to minimum standards pursuant to CDBG regulations.

II. Why This Issue Requires Board Consideration:

The Lower Merion Township CDBG Residential Rehabilitation program requires staff to obtain approval from the Board of Commissioners when a Residential Rehabilitation project funded with CDBG funds exceeds \$75,000.

III. Current Policy or Practice (If Applicable):

Approval from the Board of Commissioners is required for Residential Rehabilitation projects exceeding the \$75,000 base threshold for expenditures.

IV. Other Relevant Background Information:

The Board approved funding the original scope of work at their Nov 1st meeting, with \$87,290 in additional funds over the previously approved \$50,000 (funding limit at that time). The initial funding approval was sought during the bidding process in an attempt to avoid a delay in beginning the project after final bidding. The bids came in higher than anticipated, and additional issues that must be addressed were identified during the interior demolition work, including inadequate framing of the second floor, second floor ceiling and the roof, the absence of fire separation from the adjoining house along the entire second floor, lack of insulation above the second floor ceiling and the need to reframe the existing porch.

V. Impact on Township Finances:

There is no impact to the Township's finances. All funds are federal CDBG funds.

VI. Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the Board of Commissioners approve the additional funding request.
