## I. Action to Be Considered by The Board:

Approve adding \$11,500 to the previously approved expense of \$56,500 for a total of \$68,000 including a contingency cost of \$6,500 to bring this twin home in Ardmore to minimum standards pursuant to CDBG regulations.

## II. Why This Issue Requires Board Consideration:

The Lower Merion Township CDBG Residential Rehabilitation program requires staff to obtain approval from the Board of Commissioners when a Residential Rehabilitation project funded with CDBG funds exceeds \$50,000.

# **III.** Current Policy or Practice (If Applicable):

Approval from the Board of Commissioners is required for Residential Rehabilitation projects exceeding the \$50,000 base threshold for expenditures.

#### IV. Other Relevant Background Information:

This project was approved by the Board to fund the original scope of work at their July 18<sup>th</sup> meeting, with \$6,500 in additional funds over the pre-approved \$50,000. After further inspection and demolition, some issues have been uncovered that must be addressed, including a cracked soil pipe, leaking lead pipes in the bathroom, knob and tube wiring and some roof work. The cost of these items has exceeded the \$5,000 contingency already in place.

## V. Impact on Township Finances:

There is no impact to the Township's finances. All funds are federal CDBG funds.

#### VI. Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the Board of Commissioners approve the additional funding request.
